A recipient must be a full-time student in good standing and remain in school to complete the term following receipt of the scholarship payment.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION


- 1. Must be a graduate of Mark Twain High School.
- 2. Must be a resident of greater San Diego, California.
- 3. Must submit a complete application, containing all required parts. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 4. Applicant may not be a chapter member or relative of a chapter member.
- 5. Applications must be received on or before to be considered for funding for the following school year. Late applications will not be considered.

- All application information is confidential and will not be shared with anyone outside the selection committee.
- Please retain copies of all materials submitted. They will not be returned.
- · Scholarship recipients will be announced at the May awards ceremony.

In order to be considered, applications must contain the following:

- A complete and correctly filled out <u>application form</u> including answers to all three parts of the "application questions" section.
- An <u>official transcript</u> of grades for all high school work completed at all high schools attended.
- <u>Two</u> letters of recommendation one of which must be from a teacher from whom the student has had a class. The second may be from another teacher or from a counselor, employer or other person familiar with the applicant's likely success in their field of study.

Criteria for Receiving the Scholarship

- Scholarship recipients must be graduates of Mark Twain High School.
- Financial need, grade point average, and recommendations.
- Personal Interviews. All semi-finalists will be interviewed by the Assistance League of Greater San Diego Mark Twain High School Scholarship Committee.

Criteria for Retaining the Scholarship

- Scholarships may be used only at a California community college, California State University or University of California campus.
- Scholarships are awarded for the year following graduation from Mark Twain High School. During that period the student must remain a full-time student in good standing at the college or university selected.
- At the end of each year of successful full-time study, the recipient may apply for an extension of the scholarship for the following year.

PART THREE: (Please answer the question that applies to you)

<u>Soar Students</u>: Why did you choose to become an Independent Study student? Describe how you plan to meet the demands of college.

<u>Parenting Students</u>: It is demanding to attend school while one is also a parent. How will you schedule your responsibilities to meet the demands of attending college?

All Others: Why/how do you believe you can successfully complete a course of study in college?
